ACADEMIC PROFILE 2022-23

The Altamont School enrolls 380 students in grades 5-12 with an upper school enrollment of 216. Admission is competitive and requires submission of an academic record, the Independent School Entrance Examination (ISEE), an interview, and teacher recommendations. Altamont draws students from 29 post codes and 80 schools; 15% of the student body are Asian American/Indian; 11% are African American; and 4% are Hispanic/Latino/a/x. Thirty-eight percent of the student body share \$1,418,766 in need-based financial aid and scholarships (merit and fellowship).

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Five core subjects (English, World Language, History, Mathematics, Science) each year

23.5 credits; 20 in core subjects

English: 4 years (including 2 senior seminars)

World Languages: 3 consecutive years of the same language

History: 3 years

Mathematics: 3 years (Students must complete Statistics or Pre-Calculus.)

Science: 1 year each: Biology, Chemistry, and Physics; OR 1 year of Biology and Chemistry and 2 additional years of science courses

Fine Arts: 2 courses

Health: 1 year

Physical Education: 1 year

Public Speaking: 1 year

GRADING SYSTEM

Altamont does not rank its students.

100-Point Scale: Official, unweighted GPA

4.0 Scale: Unofficial, weighted GPA Honors classes receive a .5 increase, APs receive a 1.0 increase.

Courses are taught at Honors or AP level. Senior Seminars are semesterlong, intensive classes.
