STUDY HALL

The official study hall policy, as explained in the Curriculum Guide, states that students are limited to four study hall periods per week. This means that, during a semester, a student can have one period that is always study hall, or two periods that alternate study hall with a course. It is against this policy for a student to have one year-long every-other-day study hall along with one semester-long every-day study hall, as this leads to too many study hall periods per week during one semester.
